

Dear all RMPA Members and Annual Meeting Attendees,

Because protecting the health, safety and well-being of our members, attendees, and the broader community is paramount, the RMPA Executive Committee has made the difficult decision to cancel the 2021 convention. We considered several key factors before coming to this decision, including current restrictions on the size of gatherings that preclude our ability to meet together, a professional and ethical responsibility to model social distancing to act to reduce the spread of COVID-19, and the reduction of funding supporting student and faculty travel. Although the Executive Committee discussed holding a virtual

convention, we ultimately decided to forgo a virtual meeting because the elements that make RMPA special – you – would be missing. The RMPA convention has the distinct reputation of being a welcoming, student-centered event that provides the opportunity for rich engagement among students and faculty, and we do not believe we can reproduce this type of quality interaction in a virtual environment. For all of these reasons and more, we have regretfully cancelled the 2021 convention.

Although we will greatly miss being together in person this spring, we are excited about seeing you April 7-9<sup>th</sup> 2022, in Salt Lake City, UT.

## Message from the President, Dr. Nora Dunbar

A warm welcome to all new, returning and prospective members of the Rocky Mountain Psychological Association (RMPA). Throughout its 91-year history, RMPA has been a warm and welcoming organization. It holds an annual conference where faculty and students gather to share and discuss recent and interesting research and teaching-related information. The conference has the reputation of being student-centered, and of providing an opportunity to promote collegiality and collaboration among junior and senior colleagues.

This year the RMPA conference will not be held faceto-face or virtually. This decision was made after consultation with other regional psychological organizations and careful consideration of the costs and benefits of meeting in either format. While there is the possibility a vaccine for COVD-19 may become available by spring, there is no guarantee its use will be widespread enough to be effective. We are unwilling to put attendees at risk of contracting the virus or contributing to its continued spread. Additionally, institutions of higher education continue to restrict travel, reducing the opportunity for students, earlycareer faculty, and faculty at less financially secure institutions to attend conferences in person.



The Executive is dedicated to the continued success of the organization and to the health and well-being of its members and community. Because of this we have launched "RMPA Gives Back" which will defer dues for the 2020 year.

I look forward to connecting with you next year, April 7-9, 2022 in Salt Lake City, UT.

### **Treasurer's Report**

The Association is in good financial standing, despite the challenging situation we've faced during the COVID-19 pandemic and having to cancel the 2020 annual meeting. RMPA currently has just over \$100,500 in total assets. While this represents a net loss over the past year, the organization remains in a solid position, given our financial obligations and anticipated revenues in the foreseeable future. We issued refunds for continuing education and registration fees to all registrants, and we refunded all exhibitor's fees. Refunds were processed in April and the first week of May. A heartfelt thank you to registrants who donated their registration fees to the Association in lieu of receiving a refund.

With the cancelation of the 2021 annual meeting, and as part of the *RMPA Gives Back* initiative, 2021 annual membership dues will be waived. Watch for forthcoming communications regarding how to renew memberships or to join RMPA to establish or maintain active membership in the organization during this dues-free year.

Given that this is the last year of my term as Treasurer of RMPA, I would also like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to this organization. It has been a distinct pleasure to serve the organization as its Treasurer over the past six years and to help provide the same enriching opportunities to our current students and members as I benefited from RMPA as a student, when earning my undergraduate degree at Colorado State University and my graduate degrees at the University of Colorado Boulder, and that I continue to benefit from as a professional at MSU Denver.

his service to RMPA as Archivist/Historian. Professor Miller has formally served RMPA as President, Past-President, Teaching Conference Coordinator, Program Chair, APA Representative, Regional Coordinator for the Council of Teachers of Undergraduate Psychology, and Archivist/Historian, among other official roles.
