

TREASURER'S REPORT



RMPA remains in good financial standing with over \$90,000 in the bank. The Salt Lake City conference at the Radisson had over 700 attendees, with 135 faculty and 456 undergraduate and graduate students. We also offered CEU credits through Seattle Pacific University, and had 36 individuals register for the conference and CEU courses. In addition, we had 11 vendor tables and 3 sponsored food events. The conference registration and membership fees totaled \$63,522, and the conference expenses were \$62,289. Conference expenses included: the conference registration and program vendor, hotel expenses, speakers, and award winners.
